

# Bible Study for Leaders

## Guarding the Call: Ministry Boundaries, Burnout & Religious Traditions

### Key Scripture:

*"Keep watch over yourselves and all the flock of which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers." — Acts 20:28*

### Purpose

God never called leaders to sacrifice their relationship with Him, their health, or their families in order to serve His people. Healthy leaders establish godly boundaries, avoid the trap of burnout, and refuse to be controlled by religious traditions that hinder God's work.

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## Part 1: Ministry Boundaries

### Key Scripture

#### Mark 1:35-38

Jesus rose early to pray, even though crowds were searching for Him. Instead of returning to meet every demand, He said,  
"Let us go somewhere else...because that is why I have come."

### Lesson

Jesus did not allow people's expectations to determine His schedule. He was led by His Father's priorities rather than public pressure.

Healthy ministry boundaries are not selfish—they are stewardship.

A leader who says "yes" to everything eventually says "no" to what God actually assigned.

### Supporting Scriptures

- **Luke 5:15-16** – Jesus often withdrew to lonely places to pray.
- **Exodus 18:17-23** – Jethro warned Moses that carrying everything alone would wear him out.
- **Galatians 1:10** – Leaders must seek God's approval, not people's.

## Reflection

- Am I led by God's assignment or people's expectations?
  - What boundaries has God asked me to establish?
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# Part 2: Preventing Burnout

## Key Scripture

**Matthew 11:28-30**

"Come to Me...and I will give you rest."

## Lesson

Burnout is often the result of carrying responsibilities God never intended us to bear.

Many leaders become exhausted because they:

- neglect prayer
- refuse to delegate
- never rest
- believe they must fix everyone's problems

Even Jesus rested.

God designed Sabbath before ministry.

## Supporting Scriptures

- **Psalm 127:2** – God gives His beloved rest.
- **Mark 6:31** – Jesus told His disciples, "Come away...and rest awhile."
- **Isaiah 40:29-31** – Those who wait upon the Lord renew their strength.
- **Ecclesiastes 4:9-10** – Ministry was never meant to be done alone.

## Warning Signs of Burnout

- Constant fatigue
- Loss of joy in serving
- Irritability
- Spiritual dryness
- Feeling guilty for resting
- Isolation

## Reflection

What areas of my life are running on empty because I have neglected God's rhythm of rest?

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# Part 3: Breaking Free from Religious Traditions

## Key Scripture

**Mark 7:6-13**

Jesus said:

"You have let go of the commands of God and are holding on to human traditions."

## Lesson

Religious traditions become dangerous when they replace obedience to God's Word.

Tradition itself is not sinful.

Tradition becomes harmful when it:

- replaces Scripture
- limits the Holy Spirit
- values appearance over transformation
- resists change simply because "we've always done it this way."

Jesus continually challenged traditions that kept people from experiencing God's power.

## Supporting Scriptures

- **Matthew 23:23-28** – Jesus rebuked outward religion without inward righteousness.
- **2 Corinthians 3:6** – The letter kills, but the Spirit gives life.
- **Colossians 2:8** – Beware of human traditions instead of Christ.
- **Isaiah 29:13** – Worship can become empty when it is only tradition.

## Reflection

Am I protecting God's truth or simply preserving my preferences?

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# Leadership Application

Healthy leaders:

- Protect time with God before serving others.
- Delegate instead of carrying every burden alone.

- Rest without guilt.
  - Obey Scripture over tradition.
  - Allow the Holy Spirit to lead beyond familiar methods.
  - Build people rather than trying to do everything themselves.
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## Discussion Questions

1. What ministry boundaries do you need to strengthen?
  2. Have you confused busyness with faithfulness?
  3. What are some warning signs that burnout may be approaching?
  4. How can delegation strengthen rather than weaken leadership?
  5. Are there traditions in your ministry that may be hindering God's work?
  6. How can leaders honor biblical truth while remaining open to the Holy Spirit's leading?
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## Memory Verse

**Galatians 5:1**

*"It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery."*

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## Closing Prayer

**Father, thank You for entrusting us with the privilege of leadership. Give us wisdom to establish healthy boundaries, courage to rest without guilt, and discernment to distinguish Your truth from human tradition. Guard our hearts from burnout, pride, and the pressure to please people. Teach us to lead from a place of intimacy with You rather than exhaustion. Help us steward our calling with humility, dependence on Your Spirit, and unwavering obedience to Your Word. May our ministries reflect Your grace, truth, and freedom so that You alone receive the glory. In Jesus' name, Amen.**

# Bible Study: Connections

## Recognizing the People God Allows in Your Life

### Key Scripture:

*"Two are better than one, because they have a good reward for their labor." —*  
**Ecclesiastes 4:9-10**

### Purpose

Not everyone enters your life for the same reason. As believers, we need spiritual discernment to recognize those God has sent to strengthen us, those He has entrusted to our care, and those the enemy uses to distract us from our divine purpose.

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## 1. Divine Connections

***People God sends to assist, encourage, and strengthen you.***

These individuals help fulfill God's purpose in your life by offering wisdom, encouragement, provision, accountability, and partnership.

### Examples:

- Moses & Aaron (Exodus 4:14-16)
- Paul & Timothy (2 Timothy 2:1-2)
- Ruth & Naomi (Ruth 1:16-17)

### Scriptures:

- **Ecclesiastes 4:9-12** – Two are better than one.
- **Proverbs 27:17** – "Iron sharpens iron."
- **Romans 12:4-5** – We are members of one another.

### Reflection:

*Who has God placed in my life to help strengthen and support His calling on my life?*

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## 2. Assignments

***People God sends for you to serve, disciple, encourage, and help.***

God often brings people into our lives because we are part of His answer to their prayers. Our responsibility is to love, teach, restore, and strengthen them.

**Examples:**

- Jesus and His disciples (Matthew 4:19)
- Philip and the Ethiopian eunuch (Acts 8:26-39)
- Barnabas encouraging Paul (Acts 9:26-28)

**Scriptures:**

- **Galatians 6:2** – Bear one another's burdens.
- **Matthew 28:19-20** – Make disciples.
- **Ephesians 4:11-13** – Equip the saints for ministry.

**Reflection:**

*Whom has God entrusted to me to encourage, mentor, or help grow in Christ?*

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## 3. Assassins

***People the enemy uses to distract, discourage, deceive, or derail God's purpose.***

Not every relationship is a divine connection. Some people unknowingly—or intentionally—become instruments of distraction, compromise, or opposition. Spiritual discernment is essential.

**Examples:**

- Delilah and Samson (Judges 16)
- Judas and Jesus (Matthew 26:14-16, 47-50)
- Peter speaking contrary to God's plan (Matthew 16:21-23)

**Scriptures:**

- **1 Peter 5:8** – Your adversary the devil seeks whom he may devour.
- **2 Corinthians 11:14** – Satan disguises himself as an angel of light.
- **Matthew 16:23** – "Get behind Me, Satan!"
- **Proverbs 4:23** – Guard your heart.

**Reflection:**

*Are there relationships pulling me away from God's will, draining my spiritual life, or distracting me from my assignment?*

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## Key Takeaway

Ask God for discernment to recognize:

- **Divine Connections** – Receive them with gratitude.
- **Assignments** – Serve them with love and faithfulness.
- **Assassins** – Identify them with wisdom and guard your heart without responding in fear or bitterness.

## Memory Verse

**Proverbs 3:5-6**

*"Trust in the Lord with all your heart... and He shall direct your paths."*

## Closing Prayer

Father, thank You for the people You place in my life. Give me discernment to recognize divine connections, faithfulness to fulfill the assignments You entrust to me, and wisdom to identify and avoid relationships that would distract or derail Your purpose for my life. Help me walk in love, exercise sound judgment, and remain focused on the calling You have placed upon me. In Jesus' name, Amen.
